



E-Cycle Wisconsin

Wisconsin's electronics recycling law establishes a statewide program, now called E-Cycle Wisconsin, to collect and recycle certain electronics. It is based on a product stewardship approach, which assigns primary responsibility for collection and recycling to the manufacturer. The law establishes requirements for manufacturers, recyclers and collectors to ensure that recycling is done in an environmentally sound manner. There are also requirements for electronics retailers and local government units.

The law bans certain electronics from Wisconsin landfills and incinerators, so you may no longer dispose of these items in the regular trash.

The law covers electronics such as computer monitors, computers and printers, laptops, computer peripherals such as mice, speakers, scanners and flash drives, fax machines, DVD players, VCR's and TV's sold to/used by Wisconsin households and K-12 public schools.
